IN-TEXT CITATIONS

Parenthetical reference to Works Cited page entry: Last name or first word of "Title" / *Title* (with same formatting) and page number if there is one:

The men "rowed with backs bent to their task" (Conrad 56). Conrad shows the men "bent to their task" (56).

A source without an author named (first word[s] on Works Cited list):

Critics agree that his prose is "fluid and lovely" ("Looking Past" 29). Cather's setting is "vibrantly Western" (Western Writers).

Various interpretations dispute this (Wright and Burns 16). Wright and Burns dispute this interpretation (16).

Format for three or more authors:

Mitchell et al. discuss the idea that . . . (32). The idea is discussed that . . . (Mitchell et al. 32).

Source without page numbers:

(par. / pars. / ch. / chs. / sec. / secs. / [timed] 03:16-17)

Postmodernism made little gains in . . . (Brown, par. 17). Many of Donne's poems "sentimentalize" ("English," par. 9). *Postmodernism* claims that T.S. Eliot understood this (par. 28).

Reference to a work cited in another source:

Wright states that ... (qtd. in Conrad 103).

WORKS CITED PAGE FORMATTING

Continue 1" margins, page numbering, and double spacing. Use a hanging indent, so that the first line of every entry is at the left margin, and the following lines of the entry are indented $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the left margin. Alphabetize by the last name (or first word of the title if the entry has an unknown author), ignoring "the," "A," and "An" when alphabetizing. Alphabetize a numeral as a written number (e.g., 20^{th} as "T"). Use three hyphens in place of author's name in a second entry by the same author (Greene, Tim. $Birds. \ldots / ---. Insects. \ldots$)

Format for six or more authors:
