► Attribution for the source of the image is placed in a caption that includes:

- Numbered: Fig. 1. (and so on for each image in the report)
- Your description/interpretation of what the image is showing for your reader
- The author/artist/source (name, if given)
- What document or on what web page you borrowed it from ("Title" or "Page Title")
- The title/name of the website (not always the same as the URL name
- Date of publication
- Medium (web or print)
- Date of access

► Guidelines for creating an image caption:

- Create a text box and place it beneath the image; size it to match the width of the image
- The image and text box should not overwhelm the page of text but should be large enough to see data and details clearly
- Use a different font and size to distinguish the caption from the surrounding text (I used Calibri here for my sample, above)
- After typing the citation, click on and format your textbox, taking off the outline
- Since the full source citation is in the caption, <u>you do not include the image information on your works cited list.</u>
